The 25th anniversary American Control Conference (ACC) will be held Wednesday through Friday, June 14-16, 2006 at the Hilton Minneapolis in Minneapolis, Minnesota USA.

Minneapolis offers a variety of activities including outdoor recreation in the numerous lakes and parklands, world-class theaters and art museums, and collegiate and professional sporting events. The city is also known as a center for music, finance, industry, trade, and transportation for the Upper Midwest USA and is home to many Fortune 500 companies.

The ACC is held in conjunction with IFAC and provides an opportunity for cooperation among people working in the fields of control, automation, and related areas from AIAA, AIChE, AIST, ASCE, ASME, IEEE, ISA, and SCS. The technical program will cover topics from control theory, industrial applications, and control education in technical, interactive, and tutorial sessions and pre-conference workshops. Deadline for all submissions and proposals:	September 15, 2005
Notification of Acceptance/Rejection:	January 31, 2006
Final manuscript submission deadline:	March 15, 2006
Author registration fee deadline:	March 15, 2006

Contributed papers will be classified as *regular* or *short*. Regular papers are intended to be a complete description of finished work. Short papers are intended to be an exposition of a novel idea or preliminary results.

Invited session proposals should present a unifying theme from a diversity of viewpoints and consist of a summary statement and six full papers.

Special sessions proposals should have an interactive component and consist of a summary statement and the full papers. (There is no limit on the number of papers for interactive sessions.)

Education/Tutorial sessions should address state-of-the-art control theory and industrial applications. Tutorials are encouraged to have panel discussions.

Pre-conference workshop proposals addressing all control topics are invited especially those aligned with the conference themes.

Exhibits related to the theory and practice of control and control education are invited.

New ACC Policy

- Paper Submission Format: All papers submitted to the ACC for review must be prepared in the standard 2-column Proceedings format. See the Author's Kit at the conference web site for Word and LaTeX style files. For the purposes of review, regular and invited papers are limited to 8 pages and short papers to 3 pages. Papers exceeding these limits will NOT be reviewed. All papers will be submitted through the IEEE Control Systems Society submission website (<http://www.paperplaza.net>).
- Paper Publication: Accepted short papers are limited to 2 pages; regular and all other papers are limited to 6 pages. Papers exceeding these limits will be published in the Proceedings only after payment for each extra page is received.
- Registration Fee: One regular registration fee at the advance registration rates must be paid by one of the authors before uploading the final version of the paper for inclusion in the conference.
